Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors elect a Chair-Elect for 2018.

Discussion:

Under the VCOG Joint Powers Authority Agreement, the Chair-Elect automatically becomes Chair at the beginning of each calendar year and the Board elects a new Chair-Elect. City of Camarillo Council Member Jan McDonald was elected Chair-Elect in 2018 and would have automatically become Chair for 2019, however Council Member McDonald was not re-elected to her seat on the Camarillo City Council in November 2018.

Therefore, the VCOG Nominating Committee met on November 29, 2018 to nominate a Candidate Chair for 2019. Thousand Oaks City Council Member Al Adam was nominated for the office of Chair for 2019.

Suggested Procedure for electing Chair and Chair-Elect:

- Executive Director reports on Nominating Committee's Nomination for Chair
- Executive Director asks for nominations for Chair from the Board
- Self-nominations are acceptable
- A voice or show of hands for each nominee in the order of their nomination. Any member may request a secret ballot.
- The first nomination to receive a majority vote of the members present is the Chair.
- Executive Director asks for nominations for Chair-Elect from the Board (Nominating Committee did not nominate a candidate for Chair-Elect)
 - The Process is then repeated for the Office of Chair-Elect.

4. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS - Oral Report

Riley reported the following:

- Administrative Committee-The Committee will meet on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>September 27</u> to establish the November 8, 2018 VCOG Agenda and other matters.
- Liability Insurance VCOG's Special Liability Insurance Program Policy for 2018-2019 has been renewed through Alliant Insurance Services for an annual premium of \$1,610.

- RHNA Progress Update To ensure that all jurisdictions are fully informed of the Regional Housing Needs Assessment planning process and have clear and adequate opportunities to provide input, SCAG Staff has met one-on-one with all 197 local jurisdictions in the region and have been providing on-site technical assistance to nearly 70 agencies requesting help. The deadline for submitting input to SCAG is October 1, 2018. SCAG Staff will provide additional details.
- SCAG Executive Director Resigns SCAG Executive Director Hasan Ikhrata
 has submitted his resignation effective November 30, 2018. Hasan has
 accepted the position of Executive Director of the San Diego Association of
 Governments. Hasan's message and September Report are attached.
- SCAG Sub-region Special Elections for Districts 46 and 47- Special elections have been scheduled to select representatives to fill the unexpired terms of Glen Becerra (District 46) and John Procter (District 47). Glen and John have decided not to seek re-election to the City Council in their cities. The District 46 Special Election will be held in Simi Valley and the District 47 Special Election will be held in Santa Paula. A Call for Candidates for both positions was sent to the City Councils and Clerks in the applicable Cities. Copies are attached. Election details were included.
- League of California Cities Annual Conference The conference in Long Beach concluded on Friday September 14. Staff attended several Sessions, including Cannabis Legalization Regulation Update, Local Government Role in Meeting California's Environmental Goals, From Status Quo to Status Go-Organization Change; and Strategies to Manage Increasing Pension Costs. Staff also attended the first opening general session on Leadership and Understanding Public Service Ethics Laws & Principles (AB 1234 Training).
- VCOG Conflict of Interest Code Staff has reviewed VCOG's Conflict of Interest Code (VCOG Resolution No. 2014-01, has determined that no amendments are required and has filed the 2018 Local Agency Biennial Notice with the Ventura County Board of Supervisors.
- Homeless Emergency Assistance Program (HEAP) \$4,857,821 in one-time emergency funding is available for the Ventura County Continuum of Care to address unsheltered homelessness. In order for funds to be distributed and expended to serve homeless persons in a jurisdiction, a "shelter crises" must have been declared by that City or Count's governing body. Therefore a countywide program supported with HEAP funds cannot serve homeless persons in a city or jurisdiction that has not declared a "shelter crises." A sample Declaration of a Shelter Crises Resolution is attached.
- Memorandum of Understanding- Countywide Homelessness- A Draft Memorandum of Understanding for Ventura Countywide Homelessness was presented for review to the City Manager's Group by Ventura County CEO Mike Powers at their regular meeting on August 16.
- Proposed VCOG Meeting Schedule-2019- A proposed schedule for VCOG Meetings for 2019 is attached. Please check your schedules over the next few weeks so that the schedule can be adopted at our November 8 Meeting.

VENTURA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS 2019 LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Ventura Council of Governments (VCOG) Legislative Program is to protect and promote the regional interests of the governmental entities within Ventura County on priority issues and matters that may impact those entities. In this vein, VCOG's legislative efforts are intended to support the fiscal stability of local government, and to provide for and preserve local control of governance and service delivery. The annual adoption of a Legislative Platform will guide the VCOG Board (Board) and staff in evaluating and taking appropriate action upon legislative proposals introduced at the state and federal levels. The goals of VCOG's Legislative Program are to:

- Advocate the region's legislative interests at the state and federal levels;
- Inform legislators and the VCOG Board regarding key issues and legislation that could have potential impacts on the region;
- Participate with other Councils of Government, the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), the League of California Cities, the California State Association of Counties (CSAC), National League of Cities (NLC), Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC), and other regional agencies on legislative issues of importance to the region;
- Seek support and assistance for regional projects, services and programs that enhance public services.

PROCESS

The VCOG Legislative Committee, comprised of staff from the ten cities, County, and the League of California Cities representative, shall review the status of legislative proposals and make recommendations to the VCOG Board consistent with the annually adopted Legislative Platform. In addition to the direction provided in the Platform, the Committee will consider positions established by the League of California Cities, California State Association of Counties, National League of Cities, and Southern California Association of Governments. VCOG will not address matters that are not pertinent to the region's local government services, such as partisan, socially divisive, or international issues.

When timely action is needed before the VCOG Board is able to convene to authorize a position, staff is authorized to prepare position letters for the Chair's signature, provided such position is consistent with the VCOG Legislative Platform or positions established by the League of California Cities, California State Association of Counties, National League of Cities or the Southern California Association of Governments. Should any of these positions be in conflict, no action will be taken without specific Board direction.

Should the Chair not be available to sign a position letter, the Vice Chair shall be authorized to sign the letter in lieu of the Chair. If neither the Chair nor Vice Chair is available, the Executive Director shall be authorized to sign in lieu.

All members of VCOG shall receive copies of position letters prepared on behalf of VCOG.

PRIORITIES

The primary priority areas for VCOG's 2016 Legislative Program include:

- Land Use and Environment
- Housing and Blight
- Economic Development
- Public Infrastructure
- Solid Waste Management
- Public Safety
- Resources Management
- Local Governance Sustainability

LEGISLATIVE PLATFORM

A. LAND USE AND ENVIRONMENT

- Support legislation to extend CEQA streamlining provisions for land use projects that are consistent with the SCAG Sustainable Communities Strategy.
- Support use of cap-and-trade revenues and other funding sources for local planning activities to implement the regional Sustainable Communities Strategy.
- Seek to ensure that any future funding for SB 375 implementation includes funding for local initiatives.
- Support legislation that streamlines the environmental review process for mixed-use infill development without compromising environmental quality standards_or agencies' authority to collect development impact fees.
- Support legislation and/or funding for remediation of superfund sites.

B. HOUSING AND BLIGHT

- Support amending state policies to give jurisdictions flexibility to provide affordable housing that is appropriate for their communities, and remove disincentives and regulatory obstacles.
- Support funding opportunities for affordable housing projects and services.
- Support legislation that addresses occupancy levels and strengthens cities' abilities to reduce overcrowding in residential housing.

- Support permitting cities to exercise review and land use regulation of group home facilities and residential care facilities in residential neighborhoods including the application of zoning, building, and safety standards.
- Support legislation that defines an equitable process to determine a fair share of new housing needed to respond to growth trends in the region.
- Support legislation that provides local government with additional tools and resources to address the homeless crises.

C. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Support the creation where appropriate of economic development programs.
- Support the retention of Naval Base Ventura County.
- Support legislation and programs to encourage job attraction and retention, and to promote a healthy business climate for Ventura County.
- Support legislation related to internet sales to ensure fair share disbursement of sales tax as opposed to the current structure.
- Support legislation to update the State's definition of "Broadband" internet to current standards and expand funding for broadband infrastructure to include unserved and underserved communities.

D. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

- Support legislation to provide stable, adequate, and long-term funding for public infrastructure needs including but not limited to transportation alternatives, streets and roads maintenance, water and wastewater systems.
- Support legislative efforts of the Ventura County Transportation Commission, SCAG, Caltrans, and other appropriate parties to protect transportation funds from being diverted to other purposes.
- Support efforts of the League of California Cities, California State Association of Counties, and Association of California Water Agencies to establish an optional funding system for local agencies to finance storm water management, flood control, sewer and water supply projects, set rates to encourage conservation, and reduce water and sewer bills for low income customers.

E. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

 Support legislation pertaining to VCOG's responsibility for approval of the regional solid waste plan. Oppose legislation that would restrict or limit local government's ability to franchise refuse and recycling collection services, to direct municipal or county solid waste flow (flow control), to contractually require haulers to guarantee achievement of all state diversion requirements.

F. PUBLIC SAFETY

- Support legislative efforts that strengthen local law enforcement's ability to prevent and reduce crime.
- Support funding opportunities for local law enforcement activities and emergency preparedness.
- Support increased local authority and resources to address impacts of early prisoner release policies and criminal recidivism.
- Support legislation that provides additional resources to address community challenges such as, but not limited to, homelessness, mental health, domestic violence drug abuse rehabilitation, ex-offender reentry, and human trafficking.

G. RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

- Support and encourage regulations and procedures that promote common sense implementation of State and Federal water quality control laws, and ensure State and Federal agencies work in a coordinated fashion to enable compliance with these laws.
- Support legislation to increase the availability and viability of energy efficiency and renewable energy options for public agencies, residential, and commercial customers.
- Support programs to ensure provision of a safe and reliable water supply.
- Oppose legislation that imposes new regulatory burdens on municipal utility systems without providing funding and/or consideration of the feasibility of monitoring and mitigating such requirements.

H. LOCAL GOVERNANCE SUSTAINABILITY

Support legislation that protects local control and ensures equitable, dependable and predictable funding for vital community services.



DATE:

Recommendation:

Adopt VCOG Resolution 2019-01, Approving the 2019 VCOG Conflict of Interest Code.

Discussion:

The Political Reform Act, Government Code section 81000 et seq., requires local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code Regs., § 18730) which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings.

The Regulations require that Conflict of Interest Codes be reviewed and updated periodically. The current VCOG Conflict of Interest Code was adopted by Resolution on July 10, 2014. As a rule, VCOG reviews the Code every five years. A Code Document for consideration is attached. There are no recommended changes from the 2014 Code.

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF VENTURA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS ADOPTING 2019 CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act, Government Code section 81000 et seq., requires local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code Regs., § 18730) which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Ventura Council of Governments as follows:

SECTION 1. The terms of California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730, and any amendment to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated by reference as the Conflict of Interest Code for the Ventura Council of Governments, and along with the attached Exhibit A, which designates positions requiring disclosure and Exhibit B, which sets forth disclosure categories for each designated position, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Ventura Council of Governments. Persons holding positions designated in Exhibit A shall file Form 700 Statements of Economic Interests with the Filing Officer specified for that position in Exhibit A.

IN PREPARING THE FORM 700, DESIGNATED FILERS NEED ONLY DISCLOSE THOSE FINANCIAL INTERESTS FALLING WITHIN THE DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES DESIGNATED FOR THAT FILER'S POSITION AS STATED IN EXHIBITS A AND B.

¹ The disclosure, if any, required of a consultant will be determined on a case-by-case basis by the head of the agency or designee. The determination of whether a consultant has disclosure requirements should be made in writing on a Fair Political Practices Commission Form 805. The determination should include a description of the consultant's duties and based upon that description, a statement of the extent, if any, of the disclosure requirements. Each Form 805 is a public record and should be retained for public inspection either in the same manner and location as the Conflict of Interest Code, or with appropriate documentation at the location where the Conflict of Interest Code is maintained, cross-referencing to the Form 805.

EXHIBIT B - DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The terms *italicized* below have specific meaning under the Political Reform Act. In addition, the financial interests of a spouse, domestic partner and dependent children of the public official holding the designated position may require reporting. Consult the instructions and reference pamphlet of the Form 700 for explanation.

Category 1 – BROADEST DISCLOSURE

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULES A-1, A-2, B, C, D and E]

- (1) All sources of income, gifts, loans and travel payments;
- (2) All interests in real property, and
- (3) All investments and business positions in business entities.

Category 2 – REAL PROPERTY

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULE B]

All *interests in real property*, including *interests in real property* held by *business entities* and trusts in which the public official holds a business position or has an *investment* or other financial interest.

Category 3 – LAND DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION AND TRANSACTION

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULES A-1, A-2, C, D and E]

All *investments*, *business positions* and sources of *income*, *gifts*, *loans* and *travel payments*, from sources which engage in land development, construction, or real property acquisition or sale.

Category 4 – PROCUREMENT

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULES A-1, A-2, C, D and E]

All investments, business positions and sources of income, gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources which provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment which the designated position procures or assists in procuring on behalf of their agency or department.

Category 5 - REGULATION AND PERMITTING

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULES A-1, A-2, C, D and E]

All investments, business positions and sources of income, gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources which are subject to the regulatory, permitting or licensing authority of, or have an application or license pending before, the designated position's agency or department.

Category 6 – FUNDING

[SEE FORM 700 SCHEDULES A-1, A-2, C, D and E]

All *investments*, *business positions* and sources of *income*, *gifts*, *loans* and *travel payments*, from sources which receive grants or other funding from or through the designated position's agency or department.

ADDENDUM DESIGNATING OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

Pursuant to Government Code section 87200 et seq., certain city and county officials, as well as all "other officials who manage public investments," are required to disclose their economic interests in accordance with the Political Reform Act. This Addendum provides the relevant definitions for determining which public officials qualify as "other officials who manage public investments," designates the agency's positions which qualify as such, and states the Filing Officer for each designated position.

APPLICABLE DEFINITIONS

As set forth in 2 California Code of Regulations section 18701, the following definitions apply for the purposes of Government Code section 87200:

- (1) "Other public officials who manage public investments" means:
- (A) Members of boards and commissions, including pension and retirement boards or commissions, or of committees thereof, who exercise responsibility for the management of public investments;
- (B) High-level officers and employees of public agencies who exercise primary responsibility for the management of public investments, such as chief or principal investment officers or chief financial managers. This category shall not include officers and employees who work under the supervision of the chief or principal investment officers or the chief financial managers; and
- (C) Individuals who, pursuant to a contract with a state or local government agency, perform the same or substantially all the same functions that would otherwise be performed by the public officials described in subdivision (1)(B) above.
- (2) "Public investments" means the investment of public moneys in real estate, securities, or other economic interests for the production of revenue or other financial return.
- (3) "Public moneys" means all moneys belonging to, received by, or held by, the state, or any city, county, town, district, or public agency therein, or by an officer thereof acting in his or her official capacity, and includes the proceeds of all bonds and other evidences of indebtedness, trust funds held by public pension and retirement systems, deferred compensation funds held for investment by public agencies, and public moneys held by a financial institution under a trust indenture to which a public agency is a party.
- (4) "Management of public investments" means the following non-ministerial functions: directing the investment of public moneys; formulating or approving investment policies; approving or establishing guidelines for asset allocations; or approving investment transactions.

The Bylaws of the Ventura Council of Governments establish an Administrative Committee as a Standing Committee of the governing body. Following the Borderline Bar and Grill Shootings

DATE:

Recommendation:

Receive presentation from Joel Price and discuss.

Background:

Thirty-five year law enforcement veteran and former Thousand Oaks Mayor Joel Price will lead some stimulating discussion of issues that have arisen in the wake of the shootings at the Borderline Bar and Grill in Thousand Oakes on November 7, 2018 and actions to address them. Mr. Price may be joined by former Ventura County Sheriff, Geoff Dean for some additional perspective.

A Bill, AB 12, has been introduced by Assembly Member Jacqui Irwin in the 2019 Legislature that will address gaps in California's already robust efforts to prevent gun violence and treat those with mental illness, with an aim to help prevent future tragedies in our communities. Final bill language will be developed in the coming weeks.

California Law provides that individuals convicted of certain misdemeanors including battery and stalking, may not purchase, own or otherwise possess any firearm for a period of 10 years. SB 55, introduced by Senator Hannah-Beth Jackson, adds alcohol intoxication and possession of certain controlled substances with intent to sell.

Gun Violence Restraining Order (GVRO) laws are already in place in California which allow law enforcement and family members to petition a judge to temporarily remove firearms and bar individuals from purchasing guns who represent a threat to themselves or others. However, the law is under-utilized as there is a delicate balance between providing due process to individuals while protecting communities.

The State Office of Emergency Services is distributing grants to counties to hire full-time employees trained to help mass shooting victim in response to the need to address lack of mental health screening and treatment resources.

The Gun Violence Restraining Order Act- HR 2598 –Introduced 5/23/17 in Congress (Carbajal – D- Santa Barbara and Nancy Pelosi) and Senate (Dianne Feinstein) amends the federal criminal code to prohibit the sale, transfer to, receipt of, or possession of a firearm by a person who is subject to a gun violence prevention order. A gun violence prevention order is a court order that prohibits an individual from owning, purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm.

The bill authorizes the Department of Justice's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services to make grants to states that have in effect legislation that: (1) authorizes a family member, or a law enforcement officer, to apply for a gun violence prevention order against an individual who may pose a significant risk to themselves or others; (2) authorizes a law enforcement officer to temporarily seize firearms from that individual, subject to a warrant; and (3) requires law enforcement agencies to comply with certain requirements. "While there is no one single solution to the gun violence problem, there is no excuse for inaction'." (Rep. Salud Carbajal)
