3. PUBLIC COMMENT - NONE

7B. REPORT FROM VENTURA COUNTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER-MOVED FROM PRESENTATION ITEMS with concurrence of the Council Ventura County Chief Executive Officer Mike Powers and members of County Staff provide a report on various County Issues, Projects and Programs of impacting residents of Ventura County. Topics included Homeless issues and Funding, VCMC, Wildlife Corridor Ordinance, Oil and Gas Drilling Permit Administration, and the General Plan Update. Mr. Powers addressed the County's response to the major emergencies that struck the county over the past 18 months and efforts to improve overall response and communications as well as rebuilding.

The county's \$2.31 billion balanced budget and how the county his dealing with its pension obligations was presented. Other topics covered by Powers included the Ventura County Community Hospital, excellence in digital access to services, public safety, and mental health services and facilities.

County Planning Director, Dave Ward reviewed the General Plan Update Project featuring new elements including Economic Vitality, Climate Action and Environmental Justice. He also referenced the Recently adopted Economic Vitality Strategic Plan.

Kim L. Prillhart, AICP, County Resource Management Agency Director discussed recent policy initiatives on Habitat Connectivity and Wildlife Corridor and oil and gas regulatory issues.

4. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Riley reported on the following:

- SB 5 Sent to Governor The League's main housing bill SB 5 passed out of the Assembly 47-13, (41 needed) on September 10. Riley deferred to a later report from Dave Mullinax, LOCC. and will be headed to the Governor's desk. SB 5 creates a local-state partnership to provide up to \$2 billion annually to fund state-approved affordable housing, infrastructure, and economic development projects that also support state policies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, expand transit oriented development (TOD), address poverty, and revitalize neighborhoods. This measure restores RDA-type ongoing financing for these important projects. This is BIG! Need letter to the Governor urging him to sign it!!
- RHNA Allocations Released by HCD On August 24 the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), transmitted their final Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) determination of 1,344,740 total units for the six-county SCAG region including Ventura County. This constitutes an increase over the previous determination in the 5th Cycle of 438,000- a 300% Increase. On September 5, SCAG's Regional Council authorized the Executive Director to file an objection to this determination asserting that HCD failed to base its determination on the population projection established for the region and is not a reasonable application of the methodology and assumptions determined by the statutes. HCD has 45 days after receiving the objection to make a final written determination.
- RHNA Methodology SCAG Staff has been analyzing the determination data and will conduct a Workshop on September 23 to provide the general public and local jurisdictions a pre-view of the staff-recommended RHNA Allocation Methodology (RHNA Methodology) after considering all public comments. A Videoconference and view-only webcast of the September 23 Workshop will be available at https://scag.zoom.us/j/705186896.
- VCOG Legislative Committee- The Committee will meet on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 3 at 3:00 PM</u> to conclude 2019 Legislative work and other matters referred by the Council. The Legislative Committee Meetings are open to all members. <u>Please let staff know if you are planning to participate at this meeting</u>.

 VCOG Administrative Committee-The Committee will meet on <u>Thursday, October 3 at 4:00 PM</u> to establish the November 14, 2019 Council Meeting Agenda, develop the VCOG Meeting Schedule for 2020 and other matters referred by the Council and staff

This report transmits the Ventura Council of Governments (VCOG) Financial reports for the period ending October 31, 2019.

Investments:

The objectives of VCOG's adopted Investment Policy are safety, liquidity, and yield, with the foremost objective being safety. Prudence, ethics, and delegation of authority are the Policy's applied standards of care.

On July 8, 2019, a 12-month, Fixed Term Certificate of Deposit was purchased with \$20,000 from the Reserve Fund at an APR of 1.80. The CD will yield approximately \$480 in interest for the fund.

Capital One Claim- Suspects involved in the fraud have been identified and located. The investigation is continuing with the cooperation of other law enforcement agencies. On July 22, 2019 VCOG was advised by the Bank of America that our new account had been credited for the full amount of \$3,718.77. Ventura County Sheriff's Department Detectives have been working with law enforcement agencies in Hawaii and suspects have been identified and arrested. They are confident that the case will be brought forward.

In an unrelated occurrence, there were two transactions July involving Amazon Payments totaling \$96.30 that were detected by staff and stopped. A Debt Recovery Company, TRS Recovery Services, Inc. (TRS) is attempting to recover these funds from VCOG. We have advised TRS that the transactions were fraudulent and not the responsibility of VCOG. Our letter of August 13, 2019 is attached, however we continue to receive correspondence from TRS.

The Draft Connect SoCal – 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy will be released at the November 7th SCAG Regional Council Meeting. Naresh Amatya, Manager of Transportation and Programming for will provide a brief overview of the RTP/SCS. The public comment period coincides with the end of the year.

"Connect SoCal is a long-range visioning plan that balances future mobility and housing needs with economic, environmental and public health goals. Connect SoCal embodies a collective vision for the region's future and is developed with input from local governments, county transportation commissions (CTCs), tribal governments, non-profit organizations, businesses and local stakeholders within the counties of Imperial, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino and Ventura.

Connect SoCal includes over 4,000 transportation projects—ranging from highway improvements, railroad grade separations, bicycle lanes, new transit hubs and replacement bridges. These future investments were included in county plans developed by the six CTCs and seek to reduce traffic bottlenecks, improve the efficiency of the region's network and expand mobility choices for everyone.

In addition, Connect SoCal is supported by a combination of transportation and land use strategies that help the region achieve state greenhouse gas emission reduction goals and federal Clean Air Act requirements, preserve open space areas, improve public health and roadway safety, support our vital goods movement industry and utilize resources more efficiently.
